To all to whom these Presents shall come. Greeting

Whereas Samuel Milroy, of Washington County Indiana  
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Crawfordsville  
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Samuel Milroy  
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 21<sup>th</sup> of April 1820 entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" for  
the West half of the South west quarter of Section twenty one, in Township twenty five north  
of Range two west, in the District of Lands offered for sale at Crawfordsville, Indiana  
containing eighty Acres

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been  
purchased by the said Samuel Milroy

Now Know Ye, that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the Premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in  
such case made and provided, have Given and Granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Samuel Milroy  
and to his heirs the said tract above described, To have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of  
whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Samuel Milroy  
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
