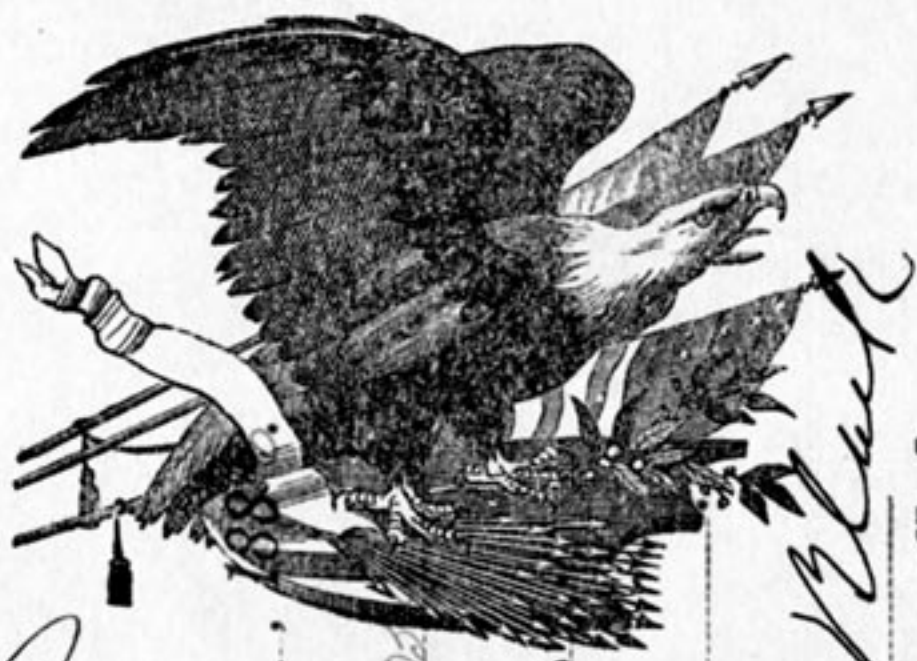


TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN.

A. on the 19th day of June, 1846, in the Company then commanded by Captain Wilroy and mustered into the service of the United States at New Albany on the 20th day of June, 1846, by Col. Churchill, to serve for the term of twelve months from the 20th day of June, 1846, and having served honestly and faithfully to this present date, and the said Company having been this day mustered for discharge, is hereby Honorably Discharged from the said service by reason of the expiration of the term for which the company was mustered therein.
