

A Plat not in Existence.

In the month of November 1824,  
Henry Robinson laid off a plat,  
containing one hundred Lots, and  
called it Lebanon. The lots were  
surveyed by John Armstrong, the  
County Surveyor. There is no  
description of Section or Township.  
The field notes state, the survey  
was made at the corner of Lot No 40 -  
at a big rock. The dedication  
by Henry Robinson, provided certain  
lots, having them, were to be  
used for church buildings, and  
if not improved for that purpose  
in fifteen years, the lots would  
revert to the donor. Several lots were  
sold. Where was the plat, called  
Lebanon situate? This will  
be found from the records that the  
land laid off belonged to Henry  
Robinson, specifically stating  
the plat laid South of ...  
There is nothing identifying the plat,  
and no church buildings erected  
on the plat, the land evidently  
reverted back to the donor.
